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

MOBILE DENTAL CLINIC PROJECT

The Mobile Dental Clinic Project is one of the landmark oral health care project rendering preventive, promotive and curative services to the underserved thereby overcoming barriers of accessibility, affordability and Cultural factors by Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences under the umbrella of NHM/DSHM operational since May 2014.

Approximately 2500 people every month are benefitted by the program in different locations of Delhi. The program has worked its way to integrate Dental health education with its treatment services thereby fulfilling the primary purpose of creating awareness and promoting oral health. Further, the program has attempted to integrate oral health into general health provide comprehensive care to the masses especially target groups like special care groups like children and geriatrics.



The Mobile Dental Clinic Project at MAIDS is operational currently in North East, East and Central Districts of Delhi. All the six Mobile Dental Clinics cater to 09 Delhi Government Dispensaries on rotational basis depending on their division of clusters:

- Cluster I [NORTH EAST]: Yamuna Vihar, KantiNagar, and Seelampur
- Cluster II [EAST] Vasundhara Enclave, Mayur Vihar
- Cluster III[CENTRAL] Timarpur

- Asha Kiran-Home for Mentally Challenged Children, Rohini.
- Mobile Clinics are stationed for five days a week in each of the identified dispensaries on rotational basis from 9:30 A.M. to 2 P.M
- Every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month Mobile Dental Clinic (MDC's) render care to the Asha Kiran- Home for Mentally Challenged, Rohini, under the Department of Social Welfare, GNCT of Delhi.
- Every Wednesday of the week is reserved for School Dental Health Programme for rendering Dental Screening, Health Education Programs and Referral Services in the schools under School Health Scheme, GNCT of Delhi by Mobile Dental Clinics. Currently, two schools under school health scheme have already been selected and the screening, treatment and health educational services are being provided.






Fig:2: Distribution of Dental Disease




Fig.3 Dental Treatment services provided by Mobile Dental Vans




Fig. 4 Dental Treatment Services Provided By Individual Clinics




Fig. 5 Referral to Tertiary care centre (total referrals =270)




Fig.6 Area wise Total OPD and Treatment




Fig.7 Total follow-up by each van




Fig.8 Details of recall appointments




Fig.9 Total Number of times Health Educational Programs organised on *Importance of Oral Health*, *Impact of Oral Health on General Healthand Tobacco Cessation* **–17 Sessions.**

Age-wise Oral Disease Distribution:




Fig.9. Age wise Disease distribution



STARTED WITH TWO NEW SCHOOLS:

Oral health is fundamental to general health and well-being. Children who suffer from

poor oral health are twelve times more likely to have restricted activity days than those who

don't. A considerable number of children, their parents and teachers have limited knowledge of

the cause and prevention of oral disease. Providing incremental oral health care in schools could

prove pivotal in changing the current scenario of huge oral disease burden and large component

of dental unmet needs.

Keeping in view of the above facts; the Mobile Dental Clinic Project initiated Project

"Neev" in collaboration with School Health Scheme, GNCTD has initiated preventive and

promotiveDental Care to new schools:

1. Govt. Girls Senior Secondary School, Tulsi Nagar

(Principal: Mrs. Sneh)

The Program would includeHealth Education, Screening, along with preventive, primary

and secondary Dental procedures, after obtaining written consent from the respective parents.

One day per week i.e. Wednesday has been dedicated to School Oral health program.

ASHA TRAINING

One of the key strategies under the NHM is having a community health worker who is an Accredited Social Health Activist (ASHA) for every village with a population of 1000. The

ASHA workers should preferably be female, in the 25-45 years age group and have a qualification of at least eighth class.

With the introduction of ASHA workers under the NRHM from 2005 to 2006 in India, utilization of healthcare services at the peripheral level has improved. Hence, ASHA's being at the grass root level workercan help in creating awareness in community on oral well-being and mobilizing the community towards utilizing the oral health care services. ASHA's with the basic oral health educational trainings can acquire knowledge, skill and confidence for performing roles in creating oral health awareness and aiding in making necessary referrals.

In this regard, the Mobile Dental Clinic Project has given the responsibility by DSHM to conduct ASHA training Program on "Oral Health" during the regular Refresher Training of ASHAs.

AIMS OF THE INITIATIVE:

- 1. Create awareness about the "**Oral Health and Pregnancy**" by educating the Community Stakeholders like ASHA and ANM's at community grass root level.
- 2. Evaluate Knowledge, Attitude and Practice of ASHA and ANM Workers in relation to "Oral Health and Pregnancy" so that proper interventions can be undertaken to improve their knowledge in any deficient field of Oral Health.
- 3. Collection of baseline data to help the program managers in formalizing an effective and efficient "ASHA and ANM Oral Health Training Module" focusing on the areas in which a knowledge-practice gap is identified.
- 4. Assess the Post Training knowledge gained through a pre-validated questionnaire

A two hour Health Educational Session was conducted using a Power-point presentation on "ASHA - A STEP TOWARDS INTEGRATING ORAL HEALTH WITH GENERAL HEALTH" was conducted.

• Prior to this a Pre Training Knowledge, Attitude and Practices assessment regarding oral health was conducted through a 21 item pre-validated questionnaire.

Following the Training Session a Post training assessment of Knowledge, Attitude and Practices was again conducted to assess the level of knowledge gained.

Field Visit by Consultants:

The Mobile Dental Clinic Project is overseen by two Consultants (Dental Public Health) namely, Dr. Swati Jain and Dr. Shekhar Grover. These two Consultants have initiated supervisory field visits in the Mobile Vans to the allocated dispensaries on a rotation basis to ensure smooth functioning and management of the working capacities under the program.

For the Month of December 2019, both Dr. Swati Jain and Dr. Shekhar Grover visited the allocated dispensaries 04 times each in the respective vans as per the Consultants visit schedule.

The consultants also met the Medical Officer In-charges of the respective dispensaries for their feedback about the ongoing dental services, and also inquired the utilization of dental treatment from patients reporting to the dispensary.

Overall, the response of the patients as well as the medical officers was satisfactory, and the field visits ensured smooth functioning of the entire program. The field visits continued on an alternate basis and provided great motivation and support to the Project staff
